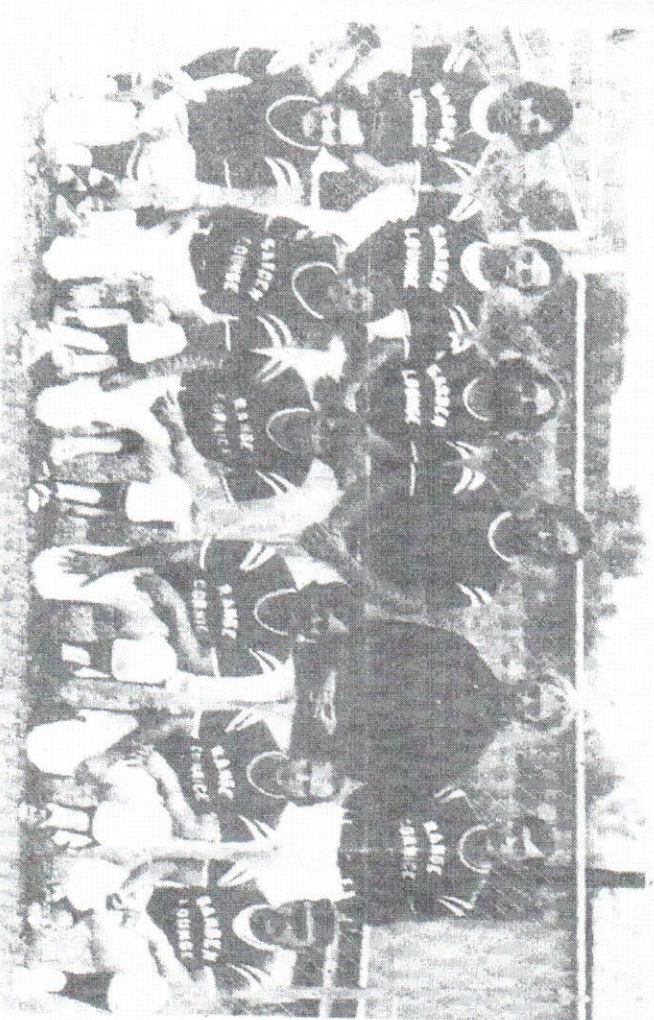

The Hibbing champions opened the journey with a 7-0 forfeit win over St. Paul Millers, ripped Fargo, North Dakota 12-0 in the second round and then topped the St. Paul entry by a 7-2 score. New Ulm, runnerup in last week's state tournament to KC-GI, felled in for the South Dakota entry and fell victim to the Hibbing team once again by the 4-2 margin.

Range Cornice-Garden Lounge continued to get sensational pitching from its aces Ron Novoselac and Greg Baumgardner and added a tremendous defensive effort that drew praise from one tournament official as... "The finest I've seen in 25 years of watching softball."

The Hibbing team won its third straight game of the tournament with a 7-2 win over St. Paul, Sunday morning and became the tournament's lone unbeaten team.

Bob Colvard drilled a three-run double in the second inning as Range Cornice-Garden Lounge jumped to a 4-0 lead.

Winning pitcher Baumgardner doubled in the fifth run in the third and Scott Sedlock and George Quiggan singled in the final two rallies in the fourth.

Baumgardner set down the St. Paul team on six hits, three of those in the fifth inning when two runs were plated.

Victory over New Ulm Sunday afternoon at Athletic Field before a capacity crowd. The temperature soared to 102 at game time hovered around the century mark throughout the afternoon.

Burly Mike Tintor staked winning hurler Novoselac to a 2-0 lead in the third inning when pounded a home run over the left field fence with Bob Colvard on base.
