Tom Nickles (Thomas Edward Nickles) aka Tommy Two Tone

"Have Glove Will Travel" was the motto of Tom Nickles as he played the sport that he loved. Tom would carry his glove, bat and ball uniforms in his car so he could go play any day or time with any team looking for a player. His collection of uniforms will tell you how many teams he has played with over 52 years of playing fastpitch – there are several boxes of uniforms! He cherishes the time he spent with so many wonderful ball players and teams throughout the years.

After serving in the Navy, his Uncle Jack Arland introduced Tom to the game. He played with Savoy Pizza for 22 years. Since 1989, Tom played with 36 teams representing St. Paul, Minneapolis, West St. Paul, Hastings, St. James, St. Cloud, New Ulm, Ashland (Ohio) and Memphis (Tennessee). In 1991, he played 140 games from April to September. Many family vacations were spent at the softball field – he and JoAnn even spent their honeymoon in Grand Island, Nebraska at a National tournament! My greatest joys were playing fastpitch with my Uncle Jack, two of my sons, a nephew and so many great friends.

Tom really liked to run and was 'fast'. He was on base more than 50% of the time either by an Infield/bunt for a hit, walk or by any means possible. His running and catching abilities helped him become an elite fielder in left or center field. Some pitchers did not like to see Tom come to the plate – he was a difficult out.

In 1991, Tom played in his first 40 and over National Fastpitch Tournament in Springfield, Missouri with Minneapolis Metro/ERS. He played in 37 national tournaments between 1991 and 2017 – sometimes playing in 2 or 3 during the same summer. In 1998, he had the privilege to play with SuperSound Tapes-St. James in the Nike World Masters Games in Portland, Oregon against teams from Australia, Canada and the United States. Due to health issues, he ended his career in 2019 playing Modified Fastpitch in Loretta, MN.

Tom played on teams winning 1 Tri-State Regional Championship, 2 Minnesota 40&over State Championships, 1 Minnesota 50&over State Championship, 4 National Masters 45, 50 and 55+ Championships. He was awarded to the ASA All American teams in 1999 and 2000 and to the NAFA All World Team Masters East in 2009 and 2011. In 2004, Tom was inducted into the St. Paul Fastpitch Hall of Fame.

To whom it may concern,

Tom loved the game of fastpitch softball. He played for 52 years at a high level. He was a good defensive outfielder, but excelled as a lead off hitter, mainly by bunting and drawing base on balls.
